

The Research Strategy Extract

[The Learning and Research Strategy 2023-2025]

Oakhaven Hospice

1.0 Introduction

Oakhaven Hospice recognises the importance of research and the involvement of Hospices in palliative and end of life research specifically. Oakhaven has a goal to build capacity and work with others to develop greater training and education for General Practitioners (GP's), community nurses, nursing and residential homes and other allied health professionals. A shared learning approach drives both relevant palliative and End of Life (EOL) care including ambitions for research programmes which enhance EOL care.

2.0 Strategic aims

This Research Strategy Extract has been created as a sub document and aligned with the overall Learning and Research Strategy document for Oakhaven Hospice, which sets out clearly defined objectives between 2022 and 2025 reflecting the ambition for the overall organisation, Oakhaven, in 'Fit for the Future' 2019-2025.

Strategic aims specific to research at Oakhaven Hospice are taken from the Research Framework for Hospices, (Payne and Turner, 2012), a commissioned report specific to Research in Palliative Care (2013). The framework gives guidance on three levels of research activity:

Level 1: Research awareness in all professional staff.

Level 2: Engagement in research generated by others.

Level 3: Engagement in research activities and leadership in developing and undertaking research.

3.0 Level 1: Research awareness in all professional staff.

Oakhaven Hospice is research aware and is evidenced by using audit, evidence for policy and procedures, clinical governance learning events and the active Journal Club, including the internal and external Learning Programme. The Oakhaven Learning Hub programme which delivers End of Life learning and resources is framed by learning outcomes researched and identified by Health Education England (2019) as appropriate for End of Life and Palliative Care learning.

Table 1 and 2 sets out objectives to meet the Research Framework for Hospices.

4. Level 2. Engagement in research generated by others.

Oakhaven works collaboratively with University of Southampton and the Wessex Research Forum and participates in the WRAhdG meetings. We also have members of staff who are actively studying at Post Graduate level which requires an element of research engagement. This group of staff have received funding towards their studies by the organisation and Oakhaven would anticipate some level of engagement in research with these individuals.

5. Level 3. Engagement in research activities and leadership in developing and undertaking research.

Oakhaven Hospice is not currently enabled to meet this level of leadership in Research, which involves innovative research with a high impact factor in publications and will not for the short foreseeable future. However, the first two strategic aims set out in the Research Framework for Hospices have been clearly addressed and aligned with the Oakhaven Learning and Research Strategy 2023-2025.

It is for this reason, one objective at level 3 has been entered with an aim at meeting the criteria by 2025. To reflect this the Research Strategy Extract document has been devised for the next three years only and requires to be reviewed along with the Learning and Research Strategy, together with the Organisational Oakhaven Strategy by the end of 2025. This timeline also recognises that Oakhaven as an organisation is expanding and experiencing development and growth and that the landscape for opportunities for Research and the Leadership in generating research, may well present as an evolutionary developmental stage in future times for which the research strategic objectives in Levels 1 & 2 have firmly set opportunities for growth.
